Hi Jim,

Sorry for the delayed response as I was in Seattle and Juneau last week. We don't have a report available to share with the public but I can provide some information. All the following is current as of 1/13/10.

For California Dungeness crab we have received total payments of \$1,302,180.02 (including \$412,334.60 towards principal and \$889,845.42 for interest) to repay the original \$2,334,334.20 loan. The remaining loan balance is \$1,921,999.60 with an additional \$17,553.86 of interest outstanding.

For Pacific Coast groundfish we have received total payments of \$9,164,720.39. All of this amount has paid interest outstanding which still remains at \$2,736,515.32 leaving the original loan balance of \$28,428,718.88.

For California Pink Shrimp we have received total payments of \$105,341.27. All of this amount has paid interest outstanding which still remains at \$176,774.10 leaving the original loan balance of \$674,202.18.

Each of the other loans for fee-share fisheries in Oregon and Washington Dungeness crab and Pink Shrimp are in situations similar to CA Dungeness crab - payments have been going to both principal and interest.

Hope this helps your meeting.
