Meeting Procedures of the California Ocean Protection Council

<u>1.-Quorum. (a) TwoThree</u> voting members of the Council shall constitute a quorum for the conduct of business, until such time as each of two new members appointed pursuant to chapter 295, Stats. of 2006 have assumed office, when three voting members of the Council-shall constitute a quorum for the conduct of business; (b) notwithstanding the rule prescribed by subsection (a), one voting member shall constitute a quorum for the purpose of conducting a meeting.

2. Alternate Voting. Upon written notice at least 10 days prior to a Council meeting that <u>When</u> a <u>non-public</u>, voting member will be absent for all or part of the meeting, the absent member may designate an alternate for that meeting only. Consideration of assignment of an alternate shall be listed on the meeting agenda as an action item. The motion to assign a alternate voting member shall indicate the scope of the alternate's authority.by providing a memorandum or other writing to the chairperson designating that person as an alternate and specifying the term and powers of the alternate.

3. Parliamentary Procedure. When possible, Council meetings will be conducted collegially and informally. At the request of any member at any time, parliamentary procedure will be observed. The rules contained in *Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised*, to the extent they are relevant and not inconsistent with the Council's governing statute or other adopted rules, shall govern the question of how Council will proceed.

<u>Order of Motions.</u> When several motions are before the Council dealing with related or overlapping matters, the chairperson may specify the order in which the motions shall be voted upon.

4.-Committees. The chairperson, subject to the approval of the Council, may appoint committees and their members. All action items for Council consideration shall be kept on the full Council calendar unless a majority of the voting members present agrees to refer specific action to committee.

5. Order of Motions. When several motions are before the Council dealing with related or overlapping matters, the chairperson may specify the order in which the motions shall be voted upon.

6. Amendment of Policies.--The foregoing policies may be added to, modified, amended or suspended at any time by simple majority vote.
