Hello,

I suggest increasing the 5% cap on Community Access projects to 10%. Reserving only up to \$1.75M statewide is too low. The costs for constructing a single coastal access project often ranges in the \$250,000 - \$3 M range.

And/or revise the criteria to allow Community Access projects to be eligible for other funding beyond the 5%, e.g. trail projects that incorporate design elements to address adaptation, resiliency, planned retreat.
